"MOTHERS TOGETHER" *Our Club Spring Charity*

Mothers Together, voted recipient of our
Spring Charity event, brings training and support to
women by developing sewing skills. We have the op-
portunity to assist the growth of this organization by
enabling them to purchase a new *Bemina* sewing
machine that will give them the ability to customize
patterns. Not only will this improve the level of train-
ing, it will allow them to seek and fulfill the contracts
they are attracting from small shops and retailers.

Mothers Together began in the fall of 1997
with five women in a family shelter. Over the past
three years, 123 women have participated in the
training and 44 of them have graduated. Thirty-
seven women have secured work or gone on to fur-
ther training. With an average of two children, half of
the women are homeless and the rest live in perma-
nent, subsidized housing. They all want to improve
their lives and become economically independent.
As one of the enrollees put it, "All my life I've been
wanting to get into something that will help me start
a business for me and for my family".

We certainly have an excellent opportunity
to make a contribution of substance and support that
will have a real impact on this new and dynamic
organization.
